The regular meeting of the Kutztown Borough Council was called to order at 7:30 p.m. in the Kutztown Municipal Building by the President, Mr. Eric A. Ely, with other members present: Mr. Malcolm A. Eidle, Mr. Carl W. Mantz, Mr. James W. Schwoyer, Mr. Archie L. Follweiler, Jr., Mrs. Jan M. Crooker, and the Mayor, Mr. Gennaro A. Marino. Mr. Timothy G. Dietrich, Borough Solicitor; Mr. Richard F. Celmer, representing the Borough's planning and water/wastewater engineering firm of Spotts, Stevens, & McCoy, Inc.; Mr. Bruce Follweiler, Municipal Utilities Division Superintendent; Mr. Theodore R. Cole, Chief of Police; Mr. Richard J. Diehm, Planning/Zoning Administrator; Mr. Frank P. Caruso, Director of Information Technologies; Mrs. Bonnie Bray, Interim Borough Manager/Borough Secretary/Human Resources Director; Ms. Gina M. Dell'Elmo, Public Relations Coordinator and Customer Service Representative; Mr. Kenneth Kern, member of the Borough Planning Commission; Mr. Philip Breeze, Director of Public Relations at Kutztown University; Mr. John Noone and Mr. Al Leonzi, Quandel Education Solutions; Mr. Glenn Gressley and Mr. Don Sechler, Kutztown Optimist Club; Residents David DeTurk, Dick Wagner, Stella Leibelsperger, Frances Tritle, Sue Harden, Bryan Rosenberg, Betty Schroeder, Bob Wolff, Sylvia Wolff, Phila Back, Doug Letterman, Richard Shaner, Dorothy Frey, Evelyn Adams, Roxanne Moyer, Fay Werley, Mr. and Mrs. Bill Fox, Gregory W. 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Bushlin, reporter for the Reading Eagle/Reading Times; and Mr. Eric W. Veronikis, reporter for The Kutztown Area PATRIOT were also present.

The President called for the opening of bids for furnishing and servicing two roll-off dumpsters for the calendar year 2003. The Borough Solicitor opened and read bids received from Solid Waste Services, Inc., dba J.P. Mascaro & Sons, in the total amount of \$26,000.00; and Waste Management of PA, Inc., in the total amount of \$18,240.00. A motion was made by Mr. Mantz, seconded by Mr. Follweiler, Resolved, To refer the bids received for furnishing and servicing two roll-off dumpsters for the calendar year 2003 to the Transportation, Sanitation, Grounds & Buildings Division Superintendent for review and recommendation of award at the December 10, 2002 Council meeting. Passed by unanimous vote.

A motion was made by Mr. Eidle, seconded by Mr. Mantz, Resolved, To approve and accept the Minutes of the October 29, 2002 Council Meeting. Passed by unanimous vote.

President Ely asked if there was anyone who wished to address Council before proceeding with the agenda.

Mr. Richard Wagner addressed the audience and said that the people of Kutztown have a lot to be thankful for this year, especially their utilities and telecommunications services. He thanked the Council for all of their work, and said that it was a shame that the Borough lost Mr. Keith Hill as its Borough Manager.

Mr. Bill Bispels, lawyer and Borough resident, asked Council to stop the “political spat” in Kutztown. He suggested that they keep lawyers out of it and not tie up the courts. He also stated his concern about the Borough Solicitor’s role in the “political

spat,” stating that Mr. Dietrich should remain neutral. Mrs. Crooker asked Mr. Bispels what he would do if he were an employer in the Borough’s situation, and he said he would handle it through a personnel committee.

Under Borough Planning Commission, a motion was made by Mrs. Crooker to approve the Student Housing Land Development at 46 East Normal Avenue, contingent upon the developer posting financial security and entering into a municipal improvements agreement with the Borough of Kutztown. Her motion was not seconded, therefore the motion died. Residents Phila Back, Stella Leibelsperger and Hilary Thomas disapproved of the project for many reasons, some of which included 1.) the project as an environmental hazard; 2.) the safety of the elementary school children; and 3.) the noise level in the neighborhood. Mr. Diehm, Mr. Kern, Mr. Celmer, and Mr. Noone assured Council that the final submitted plan meets all requirements of the Borough’s ordinances. Mr. Diehm noted that the Borough conducted all appropriate studies and received approval from all required public agencies for this project. Mr. Noone explained that student resident assistants would be hired to monitor the conduct of the tenants in the building. Mr. Dietrich explained that Council has three options on this motion: approve, deny or do nothing. If Council takes no action, the project will automatically be approved in accordance with state regulations. Mayor Marino asked why he knew nothing about this project, and Council responded that the project had been discussed at previous Council meetings that he attended and many Planning Commission meetings, as well. Mrs. Crooker pointed out that the Mayor was copied on correspondence in regard to this project dating back to June of this year. He said that he cannot remember that far back and does not attend all of the meetings because he does not have time, nor is he

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interested. The Mayor then asked if the safety requirements were met and Council responded that they were. Mrs. Crooker clarified that even though she is not in favor of the project, she feels there is no reason to deny the vote because everything is legal, and she does not want to see the Borough get sued. A motion was made by Mrs. Crooker, seconded by Mr. Eidle, Resolved, To approve the Student Housing Land Development at 46 East Normal Avenue, contingent upon the developer posting financial security and entering into a municipal improvements agreement with the Borough of Kutztown. The following vote was cast: Mr. Schwoyer, Aye; Mrs. Crooker, Aye; Mr. Mantz, Aye; Mr. Follweiler, Aye; Mr. Eidle, Aye; and Mr. Ely, Aye. Passed by unanimous vote. Brenda Winkler, Superintendent of the Kutztown Area School District, requested that she be notified of any submittals made regarding this project. Mr. Ely said that her request would be honored. Mr. Noone reported that the tentative schedule for this project is to have Phase One completed in the summer of 2003 and Phase Two completed in the summer of 2004.

Under Public Relations Committee, a motion was made by Mrs. Crooker, seconded by Mr. Follweiler, Resolved, To accept the Borough Code Office Report for October, 2002. Passed by unanimous vote.

A motion was made by Mrs. Crooker, seconded by Mr. Eidle, Resolved, To approve the request of John Kokas, Vice President of East Penn Scenic Railroad, to use the freight section of the railroad station on December 7, 8, 14, 15, 20, 21, 22 and 23, 2002 and to reserve parking spaces adjacent to the railroad station on Friday, December 20, 2002 and Monday, December 23, 2002. Passed by unanimous vote.

Mr. Glenn Gressley and Mr. Don Sechler from the Kutztown Optimist Club presented the Council President and the Mayor with an American flag to represent the 112 American flags and flagpoles donated to the Borough by the Kutztown Optimist Club that will be displayed on Main Street.

Mrs. Crooker noted that the Request for Proposals (RFP's) for electrical inspection agencies have been received, and they are in the Code Office if anyone wishes to review them.

Under Police Committee, Chief Cole reported on fines collected:

Chief Cole read the following proclamation from the Mayor, dated November 19, 2002:

PROCLAMATION

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

In accordance with the authority granted me as Mayor of the Borough of Kutztown, under the provisions of § 212-7, "Powers enumerated," of Chapter 212, "Vehicles and Traffic," of the Code of the Borough of Kutztown, enacted by Ordinance No. 12-1995, which was enacted on December 26, 1995, and approved on December 30, 1995, I, Gennaro A. Marino, Mayor of the Borough of Kutztown, do hereby proclaim the following, upon this Proclamation becoming effective:

- 1) the area on the west side of Railroad Street from East Main Street to East Sacony Alley to be a Time Limit Parking area; having a two (2) hour time limit from 6:00 AM to 8:00 PM, except Sundays and holidays.

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This Proclamation shall become effective on December 21, 2002 at 12:01 AM prevailing time unless rejected by resolution by the Council of the Borough of Kutztown adopted before the aforesaid effective date.

In witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the seal of the Borough of Kutztown to be affixed hereto, this 19th day of November, 2002.

Under Streets & Refuse Committee, Mr. Dietrich presented and read aloud the caption of the proposed ordinance amending §192-22(D)(2) of the Kutztown Code regarding curb specifications. A motion was made by Mr. Follweiler, seconded by Mr. Mantz, Resolved, To introduce the proposed ordinance amending §192-22(D)(2) of the Kutztown Code regarding curb specifications; And Be It Further Resolved, To authorize advertisement with intent to enact and ordain said proposed ordinance at the December 10, 2002 Council meeting. Passed by unanimous vote.

Under Personnel Committee, Mr. Mantz read a letter from Mayor Marino dated February 19, 2002 in which the Mayor declined his salary. Mr. Mantz then read a letter from Mayor Marino dated November 5, 2002 in which he asked for his salary to be reinstated so he can retain a lawyer and fund his re-election campaign. A motion was made by Mr. Mantz, seconded by Mr. Follweiler, Resolved, To reinstate the Mayor's salary, effective November, 2002. Passed by unanimous vote.

A motion was made by Mr. Mantz, seconded by Mr. Eidle, Resolved, To schedule and authorize advertisement for special Personnel Committee meetings to prepare for and interview Borough Manager candidates on November 21, 2002 at 3:00 p.m. and November 26, 2002 at 2:30 p.m. Passed by unanimous vote.

A motion was made by Mr. Mantz, seconded by Mr. Follweiler, Resolved, To ratify approval to hire Lorie Pensinger, on probationary status, as a part-time School Crossing Guard and Parking Enforcement Officer, effective November 11, 2002, contingent upon her passing a physical examination and drug screening test. Passed by unanimous vote.

A motion was made by Mr. Mantz, seconded by Mr. Follweiler, Resolved, To ratify approval of part-time employment for Daniel M. Wartzluft, School Crossing Guard, after successfully completing his probationary period on October 24, 2002. Passed by unanimous vote.

A motion was made by Mr. Mantz, seconded by Mr. Eidle, Resolved, To ratify the salary adjustment of \$150.00 additional weekly compensation for Edna Kramer for assuming the duties and responsibilities of the Borough Treasurer, on an interim basis, effective October 30, 2002. Passed by unanimous vote.

Mr. Dietrich presented and read aloud the caption of the proposed resolution regarding the zero contribution by each full-time police officer participating in the Police Pension Plan for the calendar year 2003. A motion was made by Mr. Mantz, seconded by Mr. Eidle, Resolved, To adopt the following resolution:

RESOLUTION NO. 24 – 2002

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF KUTZTOWN, BERKS COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, DECLARING THAT ZERO PERCENT (0.0%) CONTRIBUTION IS REQUIRED BY EACH FULL-TIME POLICE OFFICER OF THE BOROUGH OF KUTZTOWN, NOW OR HEREAFTER ELIGIBLE FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE POLICE PENSION PLAN, INTO THE POLICE PENSION FUND FOR THE CALENDAR YEAR 2003.

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WHEREAS, the members of the Council of the Borough of Kutztown, Berks County, Pennsylvania were notified on September 30, 2002 of the 2003 Minimum Municipal Obligation for the Police Pension Plan, after consulting with the Plan's actuary; and

WHEREAS, the calculation of the 2003 Minimum Municipal Obligation for the Borough of Kutztown Police Pension Plan requires that each full-time police officer of the Borough of Kutztown, now or hereafter eligible for participation in the Police Pension Plan, contribute into the Police Pension Fund during the calendar year of 2003.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that a Zero percent (0.0%) contribution is required to be made into the Police Pension Fund for the calendar year 2003, by each full-time police officer of the Borough of Kutztown, now or hereafter eligible for participation in the Police Pension Plan for the calendar year of 2003, as provided for in §33-8, of the Code of The Borough of Kutztown, Berks County, Pennsylvania.

ADOPTED AND RESOLVED by the Council of the Borough of Kutztown, Berks County, Pennsylvania, in a lawful session duly assembled this 19th day of November, 2002.

Passed by unanimous vote.

A motion was made by Mr. Mantz, seconded by Mr. Follweiler, Resolved, To decline signing the letter of understanding submitted by Morgan, Lewis & Bockius, LLP, Philadelphia, PA, the law firm representing the Borough in non-uniformed labor relations matters. Mr. Mantz explained that he had misgivings regarding the scope of

representation that Morgan, Lewis & Bockius, LLP maintains; the Solicitor and Council concurred. Passed by unanimous vote.

A motion was made by Mr. Mantz, seconded by Mrs. Crooker, Resolved, To approve the pool employee bonuses recommended by the Recreation Director, as follows: Steve Hudak, Pool Manager, will receive a bonus of \$750.00; Lisa Reilly, Head Life Guard, will receive a bonus of \$500.00; Bethany Haring, Alternate Life Guard, will receive a bonus of \$250.00; Noelle R. Haring will receive \$34.68; Emily R. Meck will receive \$27.91; and Ashlee N. Rauenzahn will receive \$4.81. Passed by unanimous vote. Mrs. Crooker noted that the pool traditionally has a large employee turnover rate; and since this is the best crew the pool has had in a very long time, the Borough should compensate them as an incentive to return next season. Mr. Robert Gangewere asked how the Borough determines the bonuses because he is concerned that undeserving employees would receive the same amount of compensation as the employees who earned the bonus. Mr. Ely explained that the Recreation Director recommended the managerial bonuses, while the other bonuses are based on a formula (hourly wage x .5 x overtime hours).

Under Recreation Committee, Mr. Schwoyer presented a check in the amount of \$500.00 from National Penn Bank for handicap accessible picnic tables to be placed in the Kutztown Park.

Under Grounds & Buildings Committee, Mr. Schwoyer had nothing to report.

Under Public Works Committee/Electric Supply Engineering, Mr. Eidle had nothing to report.

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Under Telecommunications, Mr. Dietrich presented and read aloud the caption of the proposed resolution establishing a reconnection fee for Hometown Utilicom services.

A motion was made by Mr. Eidle, seconded by Mr. Follweiler, Resolved, To adopt the following resolution:

RESOLUTION NO. 25 – 2002

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF KUTZTOWN, COUNTY OF BERKS, COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA, AMENDING § A231-1 OF CHAPTER A231 OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF KUTZTOWN, ENTITLED "ENUMERATION OF FEES", SO AS TO AMEND CHAPTER 110, ENTITLED "FIBER OPTIC COMMUNICATIONS NETWORK" THEREOF, TO AMEND AND RESTATE § 5 OF PART 6 OF THE "SCHEDULE OF RATE AND SERVICES", OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF KUTZTOWN.

WHEREAS, by Ordinance 9-2002, certain provisions applicable to the fiber optic communications Network of the Borough of Kutztown were codified as Chapter 110 of the Code of the Borough of Kutztown; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 110 of the Code of the Borough of Kutztown provides that a description of the Services to be made available through the Borough's fiber optic communications Network and the rates to be charged for such Services shall be established from time to time by a resolution of the Borough Council adopting a Schedule of Rates and Services to be set forth in Chapter A231 of the Code of the Borough of Kutztown; and

WHEREAS, by adopting this Resolution, the Borough Council desires to comply with the aforesaid provisions of Chapter 110 of the Code of the Borough of Kutztown and to amend Chapter A231 of the Code of the Borough of Kutztown.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the Council of the

Borough of Kutztown, County of Berks, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, pursuant to the authority contained in Chapter 110 of the Code of the Borough of Kutztown, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section A231-1 of Chapter A231 of the Code of the Borough of Kutztown entitled "Enumeration of Fees" is hereby amended so as to amend and restate in full § 5 of Part 6 of the "Schedule of Rates and Services of Chapter 110 thereof, entitled "Fiber Optic Communications Network", so as to henceforth read as follows:

5. Section 110-14E.

- (a) Charge for Cost of Reconnection of Consumer for any reason (other than after termination for failure to pay): Actual cost to the Borough.
- (b) Charge for Cost of Reconnection of Consumer when termination occurred due to failure of Consumer to make required payments: Thirty-Five Dollars (\$35.00).
Such charge shall be in addition to the required payment of any outstanding unpaid balance.

SECTION 2. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and approval.

SECTION 3. If any provision, sentence, clause, section, or part of this Resolution shall for any reason be found to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, such determination shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions, sentences,

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clauses, sections, or parts of this Resolution, and it is hereby declared to be the intent of the Borough Council of the Borough of Kutztown that this Resolution would have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal or invalid provision, sentence, clause, section or part not be included herein.

SECTION 4. Except to the extent of the specific matters which are set forth hereinabove and in the Schedule of Rates and Services, the provisions and fees set forth in § A231-1 of Chapter A231 of the Code of the Borough of Kutztown, as previously amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 5. All Resolutions or parts of Resolutions inconsistent with this Resolution are hereby superseded.

SECTION 6. Capitalized terms used in this Resolution without definition shall have the meanings ascribed thereto in Chapter 110 of the Code of the Borough of Kutztown.

ADOPTED by the Council of the Borough of Kutztown, Berks County, Pennsylvania, in lawful session duly assembled this 19th day of November, 2002.

Passed by unanimous vote.

Mr. Dietrich presented and read aloud the caption of the proposed resolution to amend the fees for customer wiring installations regarding Hometown Utilicom services. A motion was made by Mr. Eidle, seconded by Mr. Mantz, Resolved, To introduce the proposed resolution to amend the fees for customer wiring installations regarding Hometown Utilicom services; And Be It Further Resolved, To authorize advertisement of said resolution with intent to adopt at the December 10, 2002 Council meeting. Passed by unanimous vote.

A motion was made by Mr. Eidle, seconded by Mr. Follweiler, Resolved, To ratify approval to purchase a 1.5-ton air conditioning unit from Alltemp Enterprise, Inc., Reading, PA, in the amount of \$3,265.00. The unit was installed in the Point of Presence equipment room in Borough Hall. Passed by unanimous vote.

Under Wastewater Engineering, Mr. Eidle had nothing to report.

Under Water Supply Engineering, Mr. Eidle had nothing to report.

Under Finance Committee, a motion was made by Mr. Eidle, seconded by Mrs. Crooker, Resolved, To authorize the transfer of funds in the amount of \$7,500.00 to the Kutztown Transportation Authority for settlement of a matter at the Topton railroad site. Passed by unanimous vote. Mrs. Crooker noted that the Borough's payment portion for this settlement shall not be paid until the site is vacated.

A motion was made by Mr. Mantz, seconded by Mr. Eidle, Resolved, To schedule a special Council meeting on Monday, December 30, 2002 at 7:30 p.m. to present and adopt the 2003 budget and enact the 2003 tax ordinance; And Be It Further Resolved, To authorize advertisement of said meeting. Passed by unanimous vote. Mr. Ely noted that the proposed budget will be introduced at the December 10, 2002 Council Meeting.

A motion was made by Mr. Eidle, seconded by Mr. Follweiler, Resolved, To ratify action taken regarding uninsured and underinsured motorists protection, as well as first party benefits coverage and extraordinary medical benefits coverage under the Borough's liability insurance policy. Passed by unanimous vote. President Ely reaffirmed that these policies have not changed; they are the same as they were last year.

Under Miscellaneous, a motion was made by Mr. Eidle, seconded by Mr. Follweiler, Resolved, To amend the motion made at the October 29, 2002 meeting to pay

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Heim Construction from the #18 G. O. Bond – 1 – 2002/General Fund in the amount of \$1,246.25 for the ADA curb and sidewalk repairs associated with the street program, instead of reimbursing the General fund from the #18 G. O. Bond – 1 – 2002/General Fund in the amount of \$8,857.03. Passed by unanimous vote.

A motion was made by Mr. Schwoyer, seconded by Mr. Mantz, Resolved, To appoint Lee Erb as a Board member of the Kutztown Municipal Authority when Carl F. Wuchter's five-year term expires in December, 2002. Passed by unanimous vote.

A motion was made by Mr. Schwoyer, seconded by Mr. Mantz, Resolved, To reappoint Troy M. Arndt as a Board member of the Kutztown Transportation Authority when his five-year term expires in December, 2002. Passed by unanimous vote.

A motion was made by Mr. Schwoyer, seconded by Mr. Follweiler, Resolved, To adopt the following resolution reappointing Michael A. Barron, Kutztown, PA, as a member of the Zoning Hearing Board for a three-year term:

RESOLUTION NO. 26 – 2002

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF KUTZTOWN, BERKS COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, REAPPOINTING MICHAEL A. BARRON, KUTZTOWN, PA, AS A MEMBER OF THE ZONING HEARING BOARD FOR A THREE YEAR TERM EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2003, TO SERVE UNTIL A NEW APPOINTMENT IS MADE AT THE FIRST COUNCIL MEETING OF THE BOROUGH OF KUTZTOWN IN JANUARY, 2006.

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the Borough of Kutztown, Berks County, Pennsylvania and is hereby adopted by the authority of the same, that Michael A. Barron, Kutztown, PA, be and is hereby appointed as a member of the Zoning Hearing Board of the Borough of Kutztown, Berks County, Pennsylvania, effective January 1,

2003, to serve until a new appointment is made at the first Council meeting of the Borough of Kutztown in January, 2006.

Passed by unanimous vote.

Mr. Schwoyer noted that Harold L. Fleisher's one-year term on the Vacancy Board expires in January, 2003, but appointment will be postponed until January.

A motion was made by Mr. Eidle, seconded by Mr. Follweiler, Resolved, To establish dates for regular meetings of Borough Council and various committee meetings for 2003; And Be It Further Resolved, To authorize advertisements of same.

Passed by unanimous vote.

A motion was made by Mr. Eidle, seconded by Mr. Follweiler, Resolved, To authorize the appropriate Borough officials to execute the annual Extended Warranty Agreement with Fraser Advanced Information Systems, West Reading, PA, in the amount of \$240.80, for the Sharp fax machine located in the Code Office. Passed by unanimous vote.

A motion was made by Mr. Eidle, seconded by Mr. Mantz, Resolved, To approve the payment of miscellaneous November bills including the transfers of funds, And Be It Further Resolved, To ratify approval of the payment of bills paid on November 15, 2002, including the necessary transfer of funds from one department to another or from one fund to another, which were reviewed and approved by the Finance Committee as follows:
